# Eastview High School Summer School Credit Recovery Program

June 15 - July 3, 2020

#### **Dates/Important Information:**

- Monday, June 15 Friday, July 3 (15 Days)
- Classes are held Monday Friday each week.
- Student can take a maximum of three course during the summer session.
- Each period is worth the equivalent of one quarter. A student, therefore, could make up as much as 2.25 credits or three quarter length courses if he/she signs up for all three periods.
- Students must complete <u>all</u> course work for credit. Final exams are given over the final days; students must attend those days to receive credit.

#### **Course Options:**

English, Math, Social Studies, Science and Wellness for grades 9-12.

#### Cost:

There is no cost for these courses.

#### **Guidelines:**

- A student who exceeds three (3) absences (this means a failure to check in) will not receive credit for the course and will be dismissed from the course. Failure to attend class June 15 – June 17 (first three days) will result in dismissal from the course. Registration will not be accepted after Tuesday, June 16, 2020.
- 2. Students must login to attendance and check all of their courses Schoology pages every day, **Exceptions to attendance will not be granted** for other summer activities or family vacations.
- 3. Grading will be pass or no-credit. Letter grades will not be given; a "P" will be issued to students who successfully complete the graduation standard offered in each course. Students are expected to complete all course work for credit.
- 4. Students are expected to attend class thru July 2nd. Teachers will be giving final exams on that date and taking the test early is not an option. (The 3<sup>rd</sup> is considered a Lightning Day for makeup and follow-up.)

Class	Class Description	
Eng./Lang Arts II (11 <sup>th</sup> /12 <sup>th</sup> Grade)	This course includes a unit on composition and usage skills. This course fulfills make-up credits only. Credit earned in this class will be used to replace credit lost in (list course )	
Social Studies II (World History/ Economics) (11 <sup>th</sup> /12 <sup>th</sup> Grade)	This course is designed to introduce students to various social problems that affect them as individuals and as a segment of society. This course fulfills make-up credits only. Credit earned in this class will be used to replace credit lost in (list course)	
Math Concepts (Intermediate Algebra/Geometry/ Algebra 2)	This will be an individually based course reviewing basic algebra skills and concepts. Units will be taught in the areas of equation solving, probability, statistics and discrete math. Standards will be offered in this course. This course fulfills make-up credits only. Credit earned in this class will be used to replace credit lost in (list course)	
Science (Chemistry, Physical/Earth Sci. and Biology)	This will be an individually based course reviewing the basic skills and concepts of Chemistry/Physics, Physical/Earth Science or Biology. This course fulfills make-up credits only.  Credit earned in this class will be used to replace credit lost in  (list course)	
Wellness	This course is designed to introduce students to health and fitness issues facing young people in today's society. A broad based curriculum will be used as the basis for this class. This course fulfills make-up credits only. Credit earned in this class will be used to replace credit lost in (list course)	
Eng/Lang Arts I (9 <sup>th</sup> /10 <sup>th</sup> Grade)	In this course students will read and analyze short stories, poems, and one required novel. They will study various types of literature and reading for comprehension. This course fulfills a make-up credit only. Credit earned in this class will be used to replace credit lost in (list course)	
Social Studies I (American Citizenship/US History)	This course includes the study of local, national and international issues. This course fulfills make-up credits only. Credit earned in this class will be used to replace credit lost in (list course)
