## **Eastview High School: Class of 2025 Freshman Registration Worksheet**

The school year at Eastview is divided into four nine-week quarters, with seven periods per day. Students have the opportunity to **select up to 28 quarter courses** during the registration process (4 quarters x 7 periods per quarter = 28 courses). Each quarter course earns .75 credit (so successful completion of a year-long course earns .75 x 4 = 3 credits toward graduation). Ninth grade students must select a minimum of 24 courses; study halls will be assigned for remaining open periods. Actual placement of courses (including study halls) will be determined during the scheduling process.

Use the worksheet below to guide your selection process. Full-year required core courses (English, Social Studies, Mathematics and Science) are listed first; choose one sequence in each category and select all four quarter courses (A/B/C/D) to meet the full-year requirement. Required PE/Wellness/Safety Ed courses are listed next. Elective choices follow, with full-year courses first (World Languages, Choir and Band), and quarter electives at the end. Courses with prerequisites and other recommendations are identified with an "\*"; complete descriptions and additional details can be found online at evhs.district196.org/academics/registration.
